

# LIVONIA CIVIC CHORUS MEMBER SURVEYS Spring 2017 and Spring 2019

As a lead up to the 52nd Spring Concert in 2017 of the Livonia Civic Chorus survey forms were mailed to the approximately 60 chorus members. 46 were completed (a 77% return rate). In Spring 2019 we used Constant Contact to send an electronic survey with similar questions to the 66 chorus members. 43 were completed (a 65% return rate). This is an overview of the responses:

1. Members were asked to rate the following statement on a scale of 1-5 with 5 being the highest

**Survey note:** Since the Livonia Civic Chorus started creating Surveys for Members and Audiences, we found an interesting resource from a national group, Choir America. Referenced as a Chorus Impact Study, its title is "How Children, Adults and Communities Benefit from Choruses" (2009).

There are four main "Findings" related to this survey.

Finding 1 | Choral singing continues to be the most popular form of participation in the performing arts.

Finding 2 | Adults who sing in choruses are remarkably good citizens.

Finding 3 | Children who sing in choruses have academic success and valuable life skills.

Finding 4 | The decline in choral singing opportunities for children and youth is a key area for concern.

A bit more transparency/info about board meetings (weren't minutes made available at one point? Could they be again?)

We say it a lot but it would be helpful to have less talking during rehearsals. Sometimes it is about the music but often it's not.

- •Get more new music or decrease the repetition of pieces.
- •Would love to see some musical teachings/ workshops on the side or in the summer with Jeff or Kim who may want to read music better or things like that.
- •Change in budget to allow for new music to be purchased.
- •Hank's original "HOLIDAY WALTZ" should be performed in the December 2019 holiday concert. His score should also be officially copyrighted (he owns the copyright automatically to his own creation).
- •I'm fairly new so I not sure what you are looking for.
- •Some off season workshops from our musical team
- •More social outreach to recruit more younger chorus members and perhaps members of diverse races.
- •More digital distribution of music to be performed, both recorded and sheet music.

#### 2017 Member Responses:

#### 2019 Member Responses:

#### 2017 Member Responses:
